"ODD COUPLE - FEMALE VERSION" PRESS RELEASE

Sun City Center, Fla. — Sept. 5, 2025 — Twenty years after he wrote "The Odd Couple," his hit play about mismatched roommates Oscar and Felix — made famous in a subsequent film and TV series — award-winning playwright Neil Simon penned this female version, featuring Olive and Florence. This adaptation turned out to be just as hilarious as the original ... and possibly more poignant.

"The Odd Couple, Female Version" is the third main-stage production offered this year by the Pelican Players Community Theater of Sun City Center. It's the story of Olive, a carefree, irresponsible and outspoken slob, who offers to take in her distraught friend Florence, a neurotic, detail-oriented obsessive-compulsive, recently thrown out of home by her fed-up husband. The ensuing collision course provides constant hilarity, spurred by zingers and comic energy.

Simon earned many accolades over his long career, including three Tony Awards and a Golden Globe Award, as well as four Primetime Emmy Awards, Kennedy Center Honors and the Mark Twain Prize for American Humor.

"I hope this show brings the audience joy, a few belly laughs, and maybe even a reminder that friendship can thrive in the most unlikely circumstances," says Director Julie Ramsey. "Friendship isn't always neat and tidy — but it sure can be funny!" The assistant director is Ruth Lake, and Sandra Goldman is the stage manager.

The part of Olive Madison is played by Lucy Malacos; Florence Unger by MaryAnne Moseley-Sapia; Sylvie by Shirley Walker; Mickey by Alesia Bischoff; Renee by L'Tanya Van Hamersveld; Vera by Susie Potratz; Manolo Costazuela by Bob Horvath; and Jesus Constazuela by Wayne Keyes.

Audiences from Sun City Center and all surrounding communities will have four opportunities to see the play, starting Friday, November 14, at 6:30 p.m.; Saturday, November 15, at 1:30 and 6:30 p.m.; and Sunday, November 16, at 1:30 p.m. Doors open 30 minutes before curtain. Tickets are on sale now at the Kings Point Box Office from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday-Friday. Evening performances are \$18; \$15 for matinees. Tickets will also be sold at the door for each show; no credit cards accepted at the door and correct change is appreciated. Seating is reserved, cabaret-style plus open bleacher seating; BYO drinks and snacks!

All performances are at the Kings Point Veterans Theater in the North Clubhouse, 1900 Clubhouse Drive, in Sun City Center.



This show will run May 14-16, 2026 with more information to follow.



IN HER OWN WORDS - CLAIRE LYLE MC COLL



Where are you from?

I was born in England, in 1976 but have lived in England, Malta, Bahrain, Dubai, Kuwait, and Abu Dhabi and worked for a short time in Mumbai too. My husband and I moved to Florida in 2008, when my husband won a Greencard in the Greencard Lottery. We moved to Florida as we wanted the sun, sea, sand, beaches and theme parks. We settled in Apollo Beach, where we have been living for the last 17 years.

What's your life experience e.g. jobs, family?

During my childhood in England, I attended Redroofs Theatre School (a British stage school with connections to the BBC). I attended stage school for several years where I was trained in theater, dance, and voice work. I also had a private voice coach for several years learning all aspects of singing, from jazz and blues, to pop and opera. I also play piano and write songs. I am currently trying to teach myself guitar ... albeit, rather slowly lol. All of my family on my Dad's side are very musical and have toured as pro-musicians with several very well-known musicians. I appeared on British TV in a children's TV series, as well as performed in London's West End (London's equivalent to Broadway). Unfortunately, my parents went through a very bitter divorce towards the latter end of my teenage years, and I switched from the stage to the airline industry. I spent ten years working for Sir Richard Branson, as part of the core operations crew for Virgin Atlantic. We then moved to Florida when my husband won a Greencard in the US Greencard Lottery. I was pregnant with our first child when we were planning the move across the pond. I became a stay- at-home mom and have spent the last 18 years raising my two boys. My husband works as a saturation diver in the offshore oil and gas industry, so he's away from home a lot. It was very hard for me to return to acting/performing until my boys were old enough to be on their own, as their dad is away so much.

When and how did you find out about The Pelican Players?

I saw an audition notice for a show at the Firehouse Cultural Center in Ruskin. I was given a part in the show, and met another Pelican Players actor, Steve Preuss, who told me all about the Pelican Players group, and suggested that I should try auditioning for one of their shows. I attended one of the Pelican Players annual meetings to see what shows were coming up and how the group works. I was amazed at how big the Pelican Players team was. Then I saw the audition notice for 'The Desperate Housewives of Shakespeare' and I was totally sold, especially when I saw that one of the roles was going to be Cleopatra. I can play any role, but I love playing strong or evil female characters and an Egyptian Queen at that..... how could I refuse!!!

What is your experience with The Pelican Players and what is your favorite thing about belonging to this group?

I have been absolutely blown away by how wonderful and welcoming everybody has been at the Pelican Players. I feel like I am part of a family. A lot of community theaters don't have the vast group support that the Pelican Players offer. I've taken roles in many local theater groups, and I feel like quite the celebrity here at Pelican Players, where you have a costume team, and a hair team, and a make-up team. I feel like Angelina Jolie with all the backstage pampering. I'm also incredibly thankful at the way Pelican Players supports so many of the other performing arts groups in the area. I've been lucky enough to be a part of the recent Follies show, taking part in the Open Mic evenings, helping with publicity and promotions, as well as now being given some amazing training in how to be a sound engineer for the group, ... all of which were suggestions and invites that came via The Pelican Players. I feel so thankful and blessed to have been welcomed in by such an amazing team of people.

I have so many favorites about being part of this group. The stage/facilities have just blown me away. Having back stage full dressing rooms with showers/bathrooms, huge teams of backstage support from props, to mics, to make-up and so on and so on. Perhaps one of the most amazing things, is being a part of a wonderful theater family who give so much back to the community. The financial support shared amongst some of the local community groups, like veterans and school art groups, from funds raised through ticket sales, just warms my heart.

IN HER OWN WORDS - CYD CHARROW

Where are you from?

I was born in Chicago to a musical theater-loving family, and by the time I could carry a tune, I was performing with my sisters as The Nepon Sisters.

What are you job experiences?

I have always lived on two parallel tracks: professionally as a social worker, and semi-professionally as a performer. Over the years I've lived, studied, and worked in Champaign, Illinois; New Orleans; California; and New York before moving to Florida.

On the professional side, I hold multiple degrees—a BSW in Psychology and Theater, a Master's in Social Work, and a Doctorate in Social Work. My career in social services was long and rewarding, concluding with my role as Director of a municipal Department of Senior Citizen Affairs in New York. Along the way, I also ran a busy psychotherapy practice, which eventually grew into my current work as a Life Coach. Today, I provide both individual and group coaching virtually and in my Sun City Center office.

On stage, I have had the joy of performing in many places: musical theater leads in California, touring the Northern U.S. and California with an improv troupe, and even putting on a one-woman cabaret show in New York. In Florida, I keep busy performing with the Never Ready for Prime Time Players, the Showtimers, and of course the Pelican Players. In 2023, I reunited with my sisters Janice and Faye after decades of living in different parts of the world. Together, we joyfully "rebirthed" The Nepon Sisters. Our last show Women of Broadway was such a hit that we are bringing it to the Kings Point Waterside Room on Sunday, November 2, at 3:00 p.m.

On a personal note, I was fortunate to share 37 years with my late husband, Fred—a gifted artist and fellow Pelican Player. His encouragement and support are still always with me, especially when I'm on stage.

When and how did you find out about The Pelican Players?

When I first moved from New York to Florida, I felt like a fish out of water—struggling to find people who shared my passions and quirky sense of humor. One day, I pushed myself to attend a women's luncheon and happened to see the Pelican Players performing a mystery theater. I was immediately drawn to them and joined right away. It still took me months (and every bit of my own coaching skills!) to work up the courage to audition—at almost age 70. Best decision ever.

What is your experience with The Pelican Players and what is your favorite thing about belonging to this group?

I have acted in Readers Theater, stage plays, and mystery theaters; directed Readers Theater; and was a founding member of the Cabaret Singers. I also co-created Make 'Em Laugh, a comedy theater venue for the Players.

For me, Pelican Players is more than theater—it's family, laughter, creativity, and pure joy. And after all these years, I still get butterflies every time the curtain goes up.
